2023 has been a year of significant impact.

Not only do we continue to support each client as an individual which has an impact at a personal level but also we endeavour to have strategic conversations at a local and national level. Our job as an organisation is not only to serve the immediate unique needs of individual households but also help in the decision making processes for the future. From talking to children in school assemblies, to discussing carpeting with strategic partners at a local level and government policy with civil servants at national level we aim to advocate for our clients where we can, adding their voice to the national picture.





2023 saw us hold our first conference for all colleagues and we were privileged to welcome Phil Ponsonby, CEO of Midcounties Coop, to be our keynote speaker, building on our excellent relationship with Midcounties Coop.

We also welcomed Rounaq Nayak from Bournemouth University having been involved in a national academic paper with them. We continue to be involved at a local level of telling the true story of situations and circumstances our clients face at a local level. Jamie Crawford, a community advocate, experienced living on a food parcel and shared the impact this had on him.



2023 saw the development of two new initiatives within foodbank PLUS; Breathe and Foundations.

Both support families with children. Breathe supports bereaved children whilst giving the tools to the adults in the child's life to cope with bereavement long term. Foundations works with those parents with young children who need one to one support.





2023 also saw a 40% increase in foodbank usage from the previous year.

The impact of a deficit in donations, to fulfill the increased number of parcels, has meant that we have significantly increased the amount of food we purchase to ensure we still provide a well balanced diet for a full week, including fresh fruit and vegetables for every household.

Our ambition is to continue to be a dynamic organisation that makes a difference to people's lives day in and day out, individually, locally and nationally.

The team is what makes foodbank PLUS the amazing place it is for all our colleagues, the clients and our wider community. The volunteer base has now grown to over 100 people involved, week in week out offering thousands of unpaid hours throughout the year.

360 Back Garden



A significant development for foodbank PLUS was the addition of two paid administrators; Anni and Sara, who job share a full time position.

Both have had a significant impact on the organisation already. Bringing their unique skills to the workplace, Anni focuses on working with other organisations, including being a key contact for the Christmas Fair at Shrewsbury School while Sara focuses on the volunteer colleagues, being a key first point of contact for the wider team.











The biggest impact we have seen on a client is with client B. We have seen him develop in self confidence and the ability to socialise. He now reflects the care that he has received on 360 Walk by showing care for a neighbour.



360 Talk

360 Talk has developed into visiting some elderly contacts and a younger person with agoraphobia, once a month. This has had a positive impact on them because they see so few people, and they look forward to our visits.





Barnabas Money Advice

B is a driver who had been suffering from serious abdominal issues for many years. His condition meant he had to take regular and often involuntary rest breaks. When we first met him, his medical treatments were not effective; he was at breaking point, bursting into tears with the stress of his condition and managing his debts.

Over a period of several months Barnabas Money Advice applied successfully for a Personal Independence Payment for him to support him financially and help with his debts. He was so grateful for the help he received.



Breathe

Over the past year the Breathe Team have been focused on researching and formulating a strategy for Breathe family bereavement support.

Breathe has trained a team of seven bereavement support volunteers through a 6 week program covering current bereavement models, childrens' grief and practical activities to use in this context.

Referrals opened in September 2023 and we run a monthly drop in.





Foundations

Foundations has helped and encouraged a client to provide healthy snacks and meals for their children.

We have also provided sensory toys for a child to stimulate and encourage his development. Foundations goes beyond the weekly interaction with parents by advocating for parents in statutory settings.







Shrewsbury Foodbank

The work of Shrewsbury Foodbank has grown significantly this year. In the aftermath of COVID and the 'cost of living crisis' the client base has significantly changed to those in work and those who would never have dreamt they would need to use a foodbank. The complexity of people's lives seems to deepen and financial hardship is clearly evident in the whole of their lives.





Christmas 2022

Christmas is the busiest time of year for foodbank PLUS, but probably one of the most enjoyable too. It's a time where the whole community can come together to celebrate and support those in our community who require our services at that

In 2022 we prepared over 550 hampers that contained everything required for a full Christmas meal and gifts for the whole household. It's a chance for people to donate, volunteer, sort, pick and pack, as a one off, as teams, as families or as


